RE: Outbreak Declared at Cedarwood Supportive Housing

The Medical Officer of Health has declared an outbreak at Cedarwood Supportive Housing.

We appreciate this is once again unsettling news for our residents and tenants, and their loved ones. Please be assured that we continue to enact precautions that will prevent any further spread of illness. The care of our residents' and tenants' health is our top priority.

To help stop the spread of the illness, the following measures remain in place:

- Any positive resident/tenant must stay isolated in their rooms and designated visitors only are allowed in those rooms.
- General and designated visitors may visit all other rooms however please do not visit if you are feeling ill.
- Screening at the front door continues for symptoms of Covid or if you have had a known contact; in either case, you will be denied entry.
- PPE, mask and eye protection must be worn at all times and hand hygiene performed, as appropriate.
- All residents/tenants are to remain in their rooms for meals and activities.
- Residents/tenants who are not Covid positive or do not have symptoms, may leave their room for short walks with PPE when outside their room.

We appreciate your concern for your loved one. Our priority at this time is the care of our residents.
