How do we meet with God?

In the Old Testament, people seeking God's Presence would go to the Tabernacle, a tent-like structure easily moved where ever the Children of Israel traveled. Inside the Tabernacle was a most sacred room, the Holy of Holies, containing the Ark of the Testimony with the Mercy Seat on top, representing God's Presence. Only the High Priest was allowed to enter there, and he could only do that once each year when he went in to make atonement for the sins of the people.

When King Solomon began to reign, he had an elaborate Temple built in Jerusalem, a solid structure of timber and stone, and beautifully decorated with gold. This Temple also had the Holy of Holies where only the High Priest could go in once a year to make atonement for the sins of the people.

When Jesus came and made that once-for-all sacrifice for us upon the cross, the curtain closing the way into the most Holy Place was torn open, indicating that we are all now welcome to enter into the presence of God through our response of repentance and faith in Jesus. No longer need we rely on the priest to make atonement for our sins, as Jesus has provided atonement through his death.

What a privilege it is for us, as Hebrews 4:16 encourages, to "approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."
