

# From the Chaplain

Life is fragile.

Aren't we reminded of this each year when we hear of frost warnings?  
What will happen to the trees whose blossoms we just saw blooming so profusely?

Will they be able to bear any fruit?

Sickness and disease remind us of our frailty.

They remind us of how helpless we really are and,  
of how dependent we are on the One who holds us in the palm of His hand.

Psalm 104:29 says, "Thou hidest thy face, they are troubled:  
thou takest away their breath, they die, and return to their dust."

It seems that we need those occasional reminders.

They have a way of putting us in our place, of letting us know we aren't as  
strong and independent as we may sometimes think we are,
