Chaplain's Notes

How does God comfort us?

A good question to ask in this time around

Remembrance Day or in any time of difficulty or loss.

When Jesus met up with a funeral procession on the outskirts of Nain,

He found a widow grieving the loss of her only son (Luke 7:11).

How did He respond?

By intervening in the miraculous way of raising her son back to life!

Does God always comfort in this way, by solving all the problems we encounter? This is what we may like, but God doesn't always do it that way. Even the apostle Paul was disappointed when God didn't heal him the way he asked. God did provide strength, though, as he said, "...

My grace is sufficient for thee...my strength is made perfect in weakness..." (II Corinthians 12:9).

How can strength be made perfect in weakness?

Doing things in our own strength can make us feel self-sufficient, like the child who asserts, "I can do it myself!"

Times of weakness, though, force us to look elsewhere for strength, which can motivate us to seek the Lord. Jesus does encourage us to trust and not to be afraid (John 14).

So why did Jesus comfort the widow of Nain the way He did?

This special miracle served as a sign to show who He was—God's only Son. Though God does miracles today, we don't see them as often as in the early church. But what God does give is grace and strength for each moment, which are also signs that can encourage others as they observe us continuing on despite the challenges of life.

May God grant you the strength to continue on,
no matter what you're facing today.
