





Short History of St. Patricks Day

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle.

Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at 16.

He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people.

Perhaps the most well-known legend of St. Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity
(Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.
In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Today, sadly as with most Christian holidays it has become commercialized, and used for tourism.


