July Events in Canada

Across the provinces, speeches were delivered by leaders who had worked tirelessly to make Confederation a reality, including John A. Macdonald and Georges-Étienne Cartier, who spoke of unity, prosperity, and the future of the nation. Their words inspired the crowds, who cheered for the new government and the bright future they believed lay ahead for Canada. Though the celebrations varied from town to town, the spirit of the day was consistent: Canada, on this first day of July 1867,

would our faith have stood the test of that storm?


It's one thing to read about something that has happened to someone else, but an entirely different thing to have been the one experiencing it firsthand.

The tests of life will come but the Lord encourages us to trust him in those hard times.


So, when the winds of life are blowing us and the waves are rising, let's not get distracted by the waves but keep our eyes on the Lord.
