Civic Holiday History:

dating back to the mid 1850s
when various cities in Upper Canada
(now Ontario)
began to have a public holiday in August.
The date of the holiday varied year by year
and was proclaimed by the mayor.
Shops were closed
and the day was spent with picnics
and railway and steamer excursions.
The idea spread quickly,
even into neighbouring Manitoba;
Winnipeg had its first public holiday in 1874.
The civic holiday eventually solidified
on the first Monday of August.
The province marked the first Terry Fox Day
on 3 August 2015, making Manitoba the first
province to name a day in Fox's honour.
